

Minutes of meeting on **Wednesday October 19th 2016** at 7pm at Clyde Community Hall

Chair **John Foster** opened the meeting.

Concerns were raised over the Ibroxholm Oval development regarding trees and car parking, in particular on match days. Correspondence relating to bus timetable changes was discussed, as was the issue of green space at Merrick Gardens.

Concerns were raised over the lack of notice to residents about road closures for the Great Scottish Run.

Vice-chairman **Mark Hughes** gave his report on the strategy and priorities for our area, such as the planting of trees, road markings, car parking, clean-ups in our streets and back greens, flowering baskets and the updating of our website.

The poor attendance of some community councillors was highlighted. The community councillors this relates to will be contacted and it will be ascertained if they wish to continue being part of the community council. Once this has been done an election will be held to fill any vacant positions.

John Foster shared correspondence from Glasgow City Council about an education governance review. There will be an event in the city-centre Hilton Hotel on Thursday November 10th covering the early years.

Iain Henderson gave his report on the monthly Community Council Discussion Forum, and **John Foster** provided updates on various planning applications in the area. **Archie Henderson** enquired about the Rotunda building, and was advised that good progress was being made with its refurbishment.

Residents raised concerns about the lack of sign posters for some important buildings in our area, including the Ibrox Subway station.

Mark provided an update from Govan Area Partnership, the last meeting of which included discussion of primary school estates.

Resident **Anne Henderson** advised that the former Bank of Scotland was unlikely to become a bookmaker's as it had been sold to another business.
